

Zhaoxing Dong Village is celebrated as the largest Dong people living village in China and is also famous for its singing, dance and architectural feature: drum towers. People might come over for the amazing architecture and idyllic scenery and might take photos and videos as the commemoration. With the exception of tourism, Peninsula values the culture and customs attentively in Dong Villages, the rich cultural heritage worthy of exploration and experience.

For the purpose of sustainable development, we start a project called" The Influential", by learning their architecture and building the firewood warehouse for households in need. The unique experience to be closer to the minority wisdom.

The Influential.

Peninsula believes in the power of influential people, and we value the impact of our students. Different from the commercialized Dong Village, Jitang Village, a 30-minute drive from Zhaoqing Dong Village, faces the social problem of a large number of elderly and children left behind when young people go out to work; the loss of manpower has resulted in some of the houses being outdated, not functioning properly, and unable to be renovated. The firewood warehouse is just one of the obsolete houses, and it is an opportunity for the peninsula and the students to give back to the community.

To develop inquiring, knowledgeable and caring young people who help create a better and more peaceful world through intercultural understanding and respect. We lead the student through learning the mortise and tenon structure, to build the new firewood warehouse for those left-behind families. **Fund ¥xxx per firewood warehouse** needed to be raised by program participants, warehouse building project requires the number of students must be **a minimum of 10 to a maximum of 15 students** per warehouse building.
